## SOCIAL WORK PRACTICE IN ACCESS AND PRIVACY

Social work is a regulated health profession in Newfoundland and Labrador. There are over 1700 social workers registered to practice social work throughout the province. Social workers adhere to a Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice in providing essential, competent, and high-quality services.

## Registered Social Workers employed in access and privacy enhance service delivery by:

- Working within a team environment to build an organizational privacy program that develops, implements, and maintains policies and procedures to minimize risk and ensure the confidentiality of personal health information.
- Serving in a leadership role and as the information privacy resource to the organization regarding disclosure of information and all other privacy related issues.
- Assisting in the establishment of an ongoing process to track, investigate and report inappropriate access and disclosure of personal health information.
- Working cooperatively with key stakeholders within the organization to oversee individuals' rights to review, amend, and restrict access to their record of personal protected health information held by the organization.
- Overseeing, developing, and delivering privacy training across the organization and facilitating activities to foster information privacy awareness.
- Conducting or overseeing information privacy risk assessment/analysis, mitigation, and remediation activities.
- Managing required breach notification processes under applicable legislation, i.e., the Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act and the Personal Health Information Act.
- Establishing and administering a process for investigating and acting on privacy complaints.
- Conducting ongoing compliance monitoring activities in coordination with the organization's other compliance and operational assessment functions.
- Ensuring the organization has and maintains consent and, authorization forms as well as privacy notices and materials that reflect current legal and organizational requirements.
- Participating in the development of information sharing agreements to ensure that privacy requirements, roles and responsibilities are addressed.
