SOCIAL WORK PRACTICE IN PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

Social work is a regulated health profession in Newfoundland and Labrador. There are over 1700 social workers registered to practice social work throughout the province. Social workers adhere to a Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice in providing essential, competent, and high-quality services.

Registered Social Workers working in primary health care provide crucial and timely health care services to support optimal well-being by:

- Working with individuals and communities to ensure they are involved in decision making regarding their health and the health of their communities.
- Connecting people to appropriate services and advocating for essential health, social and community services.
- Providing individual or group education, mental health support or brief counseling.
- Working together, as a team of healthcare professionals, to provide care.
- Working with individuals, community members, healthcare professionals, programs, or organizations to build on strengths, understand challenges, and develop plans to meet individual and community needs.
- Working with individuals and community members to promote health, build healthy public policy and create environments which support healthy living.
